



2020-2021 Scholarship Program for Graduating High School Seniors

Guidelines

Program Guidelines & Priorities:

- * Seeking graduating seniors attending high school in the United States with a record of leadership and volunteerism in the community in non-school sponsored activities and participation in extracurricular school activities.
- * Applicant must complete high school by the spring of 2020.
- * Applicant must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale, excluding home school studies) and plan to attend an accredited HBCU. (HBCU is defined as “historically black colleges and universities”.)
- * Applicant must apply to and be accepted into an accredited HBCU by July 1, 2020.
- * Applicant must have minimum SAT score of 1150 or ACT score of 21.
- * Applicant must be a United States Citizen
- * Applicant must intend on pursuing an undergraduate degree in the sciences with the intention of pursuing that discipline as a career. The following majors will be considered: Biomedical and Biological Sciences, Engineering and Engineering Technology, Health Professions, Mathematics and Statistics, Physical Sciences, Psychology, Science Technology.
- * Applicant must plan to matriculate at accredited HBCU for the Fall 2020/Spring 2021 academic year (enrollment must begin in the Fall) with the intention of maintaining full-time status for the entire year.
- * Applicant must have the endorsement of his/her guidance counselor on their application attesting he/she is a qualified fit for this scholarship program.
- * Applicant must submit two letters of recommendation that are specific to your application to the Freemont Foundation Scholarship Program: one from a high school teacher, counselor, or principal and one from a local community member or officer of an organization in which the applicant is affiliated. **Do not submit more than two letters.**
- * Applicant must submit the most recent official transcript. This transcript must contain the official school stamp or seal.
- * Applications and all supporting documents must be postmarked January 31, 2020. Late applications and supporting documents will not be accepted.

The scholarship award will be announced no later than April 2020. **Scholarship funds will be paid in September 2020 for the Fall semester directly to the college/university** and not to the student. It will be the student's responsibility to submit to the Foundation at that time proof of enrollment for the Fall 2020 semester that will include student ID number and college information.
